Christian Books Used for Women's Jail Ministry

If you have any Christian **paperback** books that you are willing to pass along, please bring them to the Fall Gathering (Nov. 10-12) for use at the Lake County Detention Center a/k/a Lake County Jail. The books should be gently-used Christian **paperback** books. They can be fiction or nonfiction, including biographies and autobiographies; humor; poetry; or about addiction, marriage, relationships, or parenting. We cannot use books that are heavily underlined or highlighted, or if it has been written in. If the writing in the book is limited to your name or an inscription when a book is received as a gift, we can blot that out with a permanent marker and still use the book.

Bibles are not needed. The Chaplain has a source for Bibles so the women are all using the same version and can easily turn to a specific page number during Bible studies.
