#### Anne's Advice

With the completion of our Fall Gathering, I feel like another page has turned and I can reflect with gratitude on the many enriching experiences I have enjoyed this year as your SWO President. I also know that I must look ahead to what my life could be like when another woman will be chosen at our next Fall Gathering.

The message of "Holy Ground" deeply moved me because of surprising experiences I have had in the second half of this year. It takes a lot to get my attention. At the end of August, I caused an auto collision. I made a left turn in front of another car because I misjudged his speed and distance. He slammed into my passenger door. As I climbed out of my car, the driver of the other car rushed over to me. He didn't say, "You stupid old cow, why didn't you watch where you were going!" He asked if I was alright, and when I said yes, he said, "Praise God!" It takes a while to complete all the legal formalities of a collision and wait for the tow trucks. The amazing thing was the sense of peace that enveloped both Mike and me. We exchanged our names and contact information. We praised God's mercy. My friend Cindy came to wait with me and take me home. She commented on the spirit of caring and peace that we all shared that afternoon. We all prayed together. In the days ahead, Mike would send me a text occasionally to make sure I was alright. At one point, he asked if I'd mind if he sent me information about something important to him. He said that he was kind of a poster child for this organization. He sent me a flyer for the Cold Weather Shelter. When I called the phone number on the flyer, I realized that God had gotten my attention so I could make a sacrificial gift to this organization to enable them to purchase supplies before the cold weather brought homeless people into the shelter for a hot meal and a warm place to sleep. Now I will take time to discern if God is calling me to do more.

The Women of Hope Lutheran Church in the Villages invited me to their Fall Retreat at their Lake Weir Campus. Their guest speaker, *Gaye Martin*, joined us by Zoom. The theme was "Can You Hear Me Now?" In a few funny, entertaining segments, Gaye shared anecdotes from her personal life about hearing God's voice. Because she is a pilot, she talked about the importance of always listening for the voice of the air traffic controller. Even though the air traffic

controller is watching many planes at a time, and sometimes his directions may not make sense to you, he is watching you and you must trust him to guide you home. My favorite of the stories she told made the point that we may not recognize at the time that God has given a message through another person. At her first dance as a young girl, she lined up along the gym wall with the other young girls, worrying that no one would ask them to dance; then worrying that someone would. A boy came up and asked, and she said yes. When that song was over, he asked if she wanted to do it again. That went ahead with no difficulty. He asked if she wanted to try again. When Gaye answered yes, he said, "Can I lead this time?" It was more than sixty years before Gaye realized that she should let God lead.

Just as we heard at Fall Gathering, God may speak to us in unexpected and surprising ways. I don't want to meet God by accident again. It would be better if I be still and listen for the voice of the one who will bring me in for a safe landing at the right destination. I need to spend more time reading the Bible with intention, seeking God's instruction for me. I need to set aside time for prayer and ask for discernment. I ask that all of you may lift up a prayer for me. I need to let God lead in my daily dance through life, and listen for his voice to tell me how I can use my gifts to serve him better.

#### **My First Triennial Gathering**

After the Triennial Convention, I attended my very first Triennial Gathering on September 21<sup>st</sup>-24<sup>th</sup>. To my amazement, over 1,100 WELCA women gathered at the Phoenix, Arizonia Convention Center. I hope that I was not on camera with my shocked look as I entered the convention meeting room. I have never been surrounded by so much love. There were my Christian sisters from all over the United States. They handed out gifts presented from their Conferences. To my surprise, I was told that this was the lowest attendance and the first face to face Gathering since COVID. The pre-COVID attendance was at least 3,000! WOW! Being my first, I did not think 1,100 in attendance was bad at all. The speakers were very informative, even some funny. The Worship Service was meaningful and Spirit-filled.

There were a few things that I took away from the Gathering and that will remain in my mind, forever. One thing I will remember to never say is "Refugees," but instead "New Americans." I will remind mindful that no one ever wants to leave their home. But sometimes it is necessary for the survival of self or family. Just think if someone or the government made our very existence unbearable and life threatening and we had to make the sacrifice of leaving the place that we call home. Just think what would that be like for you and your family? Scary thought, isn't it? The statement "Justice is what love looks like in public."

#### **ELCA Fund for Leaders** *Scholarship*



Do you know a seminary student who is currently attending one of the ELCA seminaries? Encourage them to apply for the Fund for Leaders Scholarship(s) awarded by the Board of the Florida-Bahamas Synodical Women's Organization ("SWO").

Seminary students must meet the following criteria:

- 1) Applicants must be in the candidacy process and have been verified with the Florida-Bahamas Synod Candidacy Chair.
- 2) Seminary students must be attending one of the eight ELCA seminaries and are either in the Master of Divinity (M.DIV), Master of Arts (MA), or Theological Education for Emerging Ministries (TEEM) programs.
- 3) Preference will be given to residents of the Florida-Bahamas Synod, female applicants, and active members of congregational units.
- 4) Applications will be accepted each year beginning on November 1 with a deadline of December 15 for submission.
- 5) The selected candidate(s) will be invited to attend the SWO's Fall Gathering, to participate in the weekend's activities, and to present a brief greeting. If the scholarship recipient(s) is unable to attend the Fall Gathering, a video may be submitted.
