Recently, every conversation I have had, every news item I have read, and all the social media I see or hear, have all bombarded me with catastrophe and disaster, death and destruction. It's enough to make a person feel depressed and hopeless. But all I need to do is shift my perspective. In baptism, I was given a new life. I live in this world, but through Jesus's resurrection, I also live in the kingdom of heaven. When I feel angry or hopeless because I wonder how people can believe the things they believe, or think the things they think, or say the things they say, or do the things they do, I need to see them as Jesus sees them. Each of them is created in the image of God - unique and loved. They are caught up in the values of the world and need my prayers and kindness. My job is to love our neighbors, not judge them.

People respond to extreme weather and rising sea levels with anxiety about long term effects on agriculture, migration, housing, and health. We feel powerless to make lifestyle changes to reduce our consumption of fossil fuels, or manufactured goods, or processed food. God has given me the answer to that also. In Luke 12:22-23, Jesus tells his disciples: "...do not worry. . . Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life?" I must pray for discernment to manage my own consumption of resources. I can share my abundance to feed the hungry and shelter the poor, but God will control the sun and rain.

You live in the eternal Kingdom of God as well as this chaotic twenty-first century of Earth. Don't let yourself be so distracted by the noise of the world. Be still, have faith, and find the wisdom and peace of God's steadfast love.

My best advice from last year is still the best advice I have: pray, breathe, drink plenty of water, and get a good night's sleep.

For offerings going to Churchwide, Use **Form B** and send directly to Churchwide. These would include offerings such as Katies Fund and Thankofferings. Your SWO forwards 55% of all regular offerings we receive from the Units to the Churchwide Organization to support the ministries of WELCA.

LEADER'S ME



The Florida-Bahamas Synodical Women's Organization executive and advisory board members were joined by the conference leaders at Luther Springs, January 26-28. During our time together we explored our spiritual gifts using "Gifts for You: opening your spiritual gifts," a study resource from Women of the ELCA. We all completed the Spiritual Gifts Assessment and shared ideas about how to use our gifts most effectively. We talked about our diversity and our appreciation for each other.

Our Planning Co-Chairs, Donna Person and Gayle Backiel, shared details about Fall Gathering to be held at Warren Willis Camp and Conference Center from Friday, November 8 through Sunday, November 10, 2024. The theme, "He's Got the Whole World in His Hands," is based on 2 Chronicles 7:14, " . . . if my people, who are called by my name, humble themselves, pray, seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land." The logo will be a globe, held in God's hands, with the words "Be Humble, Seek God, Repent, Pray, He will Forgive, He Will Heal" forming an arch over the globe. The Conference Leaders chose their Fall Gathering responsibilities and a board member was assigned to each.

While Board members held their business meeting, Conference Leaders went to the dining room to discuss plans for Spring Gatherings. They chose the theme: *Peace, Be Not Anxious*. They chose Philippians 4:6-7 as their Bible verse. Proverbs 3:5-6 is another supporting verse.

In response to evaluations turned in at Fall Gathering 2023, *Tracy Moffatt* realized the need to update and streamline procedures for our business meetings. This work has begun and will be reviewed at our Summer Meeting.

There were three applicants for the Fund for Leaders Scholarship. *Boris Camille* from Miami Shores has

been admitted to the TEEM program at California Lutheran University. *Beatrice B. D'Angelo* from Naples is pursuing a Master of Divinity at Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary. *Heather Hedman-DeVaughn* from Parkland is pursuing a Master of Divinity at United Lutheran Seminary. After a lively discussion, the board members chose to designate a portion of available funds to each applicant.

We talked about the need to increase and diversify our communication with all the Women of the Evangelical Church in America, regardless of their active participation in a WELCA circle. If you are a person who spends some time on Facebook, follow "Florida/Bahamas Women of the ELCA." Every time you see one of their posts, like and share on your feed. This will send out ripples that will spread information, inspiration, and encouragement.

Once all attendees came together, we looked at the dates and locations of each of the Spring Gatherings that had been determined, and a Board member was assigned to each. This work was accomplished quickly and enthusiastically together.



Saturday afternoon was sunny and warm. We had worked together so effectively that there was time for a break. We all got outside and explored the beautiful surroundings at

Luther Springs. Many of us walked down the path to Lake Vause and the labyrinth. We had not met at Luther Springs in several years because of Covid in 2021 and 2022 followed by the need to explore Warren Willis in 2023, It was wonderful to enjoy Luther Springs again.

Depending on the availability of <u>St. John Lutheran</u> <u>Church in Winter Park</u>, the Board will hold their Summer Meeting there on **August 3, 2024**.

Spring Gatherings Coming Soon!

Spring is getting ready to spring. So are the Conferences with their Spring Gatherings.

This year's theme is "Peace, be not anxious" from the Bible verse Philippians 4:6-7: Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the

peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Encourage your members to attend the event. Here are some ideas to help. Some samples are included here.

- Try making a tri-fold or poster about the Gathering with a sign-up sheet. Someone should be nearby to answer questions.
- Print out invitations to be handed to women at the end of a church service.
- Send an email blast to everyone in your congregation, telling about the event.

Be sure to include information about the gathering such as where it will be held and when. Let them know if there will be Bible Study, an offering, worship service, food, and how much will it cost for the day. Be sure it is clear that this is an event intended for the women of the church and they are welcome to bring a friend.

Church Women United World Day of Prayer

The World Day of Prayer is an ecumenical movement inspired by the motto "Informed Prayer and Prayerful Action." Church Women United follows the example of Jesus Christ, who prayed from a place of knowledge and care for the world, and who acted from a place of prayer and connection to God. From Aug 20-27, delegates from Catholic, Protestant and Orthodox traditions met to select the theme and writers for 2024. An ecumenical group of Palestinian Christian women have prayed and reflected together over the past several years to respond to the invitation to write the 2024 program. Their theme is "I Beg You... Bear With One Another in Love," is based on Ephesians 4:1-7. This program calls us to bear with each other in love, despite all difficulties and oppression.

The Worship Service shares stories of three Palestinian Christian women, who witness to the power of bearing together in love. Their stories illuminate the experiences of Palestinian women from three different generations. The symbol of an olive tree is used throughout the worship service. This represents the three generations through the trunk, branches, and leaves of the olive tree. Picture the Palestinian Christian women who wrote this worship service have invited the world to pray for peace, justice and freedom of religion and freedom of movement. Their prayers specifically call us to pray with women, refugees, persons experiencing homelessness, and all who are sick, dying and grieving. They also call us to confess to our collective role in causing the climate crisis, and to commit to repairing what we have destroyed. Finally, they call us, the global church, to be united in treating all with justice and love.

The Bible Study calls us to ask what it means to bear with someone in love. And it asks us to reflect on why community is important for Christians. The Bible study challenges us to lift up others around us, and allow others to lift us up.

The Children's Program invites children to reflect on how standing together in love makes us all feel stronger and less alone. It encourages children to imagine how the world could be more loving.

The Country Background gives information about the history and culture of Palestine. It mentions places that have significance for Christians, being the birthplace of Christianity. It also reflects on the role of women in Palestinian society, and the history of the World Day of Prayer movement in Palestine.

This program was developed entirely in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic. Taking on the responsibility of being a writer country is always a rigorous journey, but it was particularly difficult given the changed realities of a world suffering under a global pandemic. We are grateful to our Palestinian Christian sisters for navigating this process with grace and patience.

Breathe in, Breath out!

Life piles up on us and we forget to do these simple things in a meaningful manner. Sure, we pray; we breath; we drink some water; and we sleep. But, how deeply do we do these everyday practices, especially breathing.

Do I have a deal for you! A two for one...like a BOGO! Try the breath prayer. As you pray the first pray of the sentence, breathe in deeply. And as you pray the second part of the sentence, exhale deeply.

Breathe in as you pray (inhale): I receive your love.
Breathe out as you pray (exhale): and release my insecurity.

As you make your way through this prayer, your breathing will certainly improve and your prayer petitions will be raised up to our God.

We begin Lent in February this year. Adding this to your day might improve your health both physically and spiritually.
